

14. PRIZE MONEY

Prize money for the event will be provided, as IFSC regulation for standard IFSC World Cups

15. QUOTAS

Due to logistic and infrastructural limitation, the Event will be able to host a **maximum** cap of **160 athletes, 80 per gender.**

Therefore, the quota is fixed to a **maximum** of **4 athletes per gender**, **for each National Federation**; for the host nation, 8 competitors; no pre-qualified will be assigned to the B&L event. However, if at the registration deadline the quota will exceed 80 athletes per gender, the following mechanics will take place.

The 80 athletes that will be selected for the events will be those with the highest combination of ranking between the Boulder World Ranking (CUWR) points and the Lead World Ranking (CUWR) points at the **registration deadline**. The points cumulated in the two rankings will be added to identify the top 80 athletes of the ranking. Example below

In case of ties (including the case where athletes have zero points), the following mechanism will take place:

The selection will be based on the National Team rankings of the National Federation (overall, not split by gender). The National Team rankings of Boulder and Lead will be cumulated to understand the ranking among NFs. The NFs with the highest ranking will be ranked first, and will have the priority of selection. Example below

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In case of further ties (i.e. National Federations without a National Team ranking), the athletes will be selected randomly by the IFSC.

16. DEROGATION TO IFSC RULES

Due to logistic and infrastructural limitation, the following derogation to IFSC rules will apply:

Article 11.10. Where:

A) in respect of the Qualification or Semi-Final round, consecutive stages take place on the same day, there should be a minimum time gap of two (2) hours 30 minutes between the time when the last competitor finishes the first stage and the scheduled start of the following stage.

Article 11.20.

Each boulder will score a maximum of 25 points, with scoring values (the "Base Score") assigned as follow:

- A. 25 points where the competitor has Controlled the Top Hold (regardless as to whether the competitor has Controlled any Zone Hold on the boulder);
- B. six (6) points ten (10) points where the competitor has Controlled the second Zone Hold but not the Top Hold (regardless as to whether the first Zone Hold has been Controlled on any attempt);
- C. three (3) points five (5) points where the competitor has Controlled the first Zone Hold only

Article 11.21 will be modified to reflect the following scoring principle:

- The highest 40 holds of the lead route will grant points to the athletes (instead of 30 holds)
- The highest 10 holds of the lead route will grant a score of 4 points for each hold (a total of 40 points for the section)
- The following 10 holds of the lead route will grant a score of 3 points for each hold (a total of 30 points for the section)
- The following 10 holds of the lead route will grant a score of 2 points for each hold (a total of 20 points for the section)
- The following 10 holds of the lead route will grant a score of 1 points for each hold (a total of 10 points for the section)
- The following X number of the lead route will grant a score of 0 points for each hold

Athletes are sent on the Field Of Play, when the FOP is empty from previous competitors. Example:

If <u>Athlete 5</u> finishes his/her attempt in Boulder 2 in one minute, the next climber on Boulder 2 (<u>Athlete 6</u>), will not be sent on stage until <u>Athlete 1</u> completes his/her attempt in Boulder 3.

17. TICKETS

No tickets will be sold for this competition. Tickets have been given away by lottery to mainly to citizen of Iwate and some to Japanese citizen. Following the travel restriction to be lifted from October 11, for the family and friends of the athletes, Event Organizer will reserve one ticket per an athlete who is registered for the event. The tickets will be handed to NFs at the technical meeting.

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
