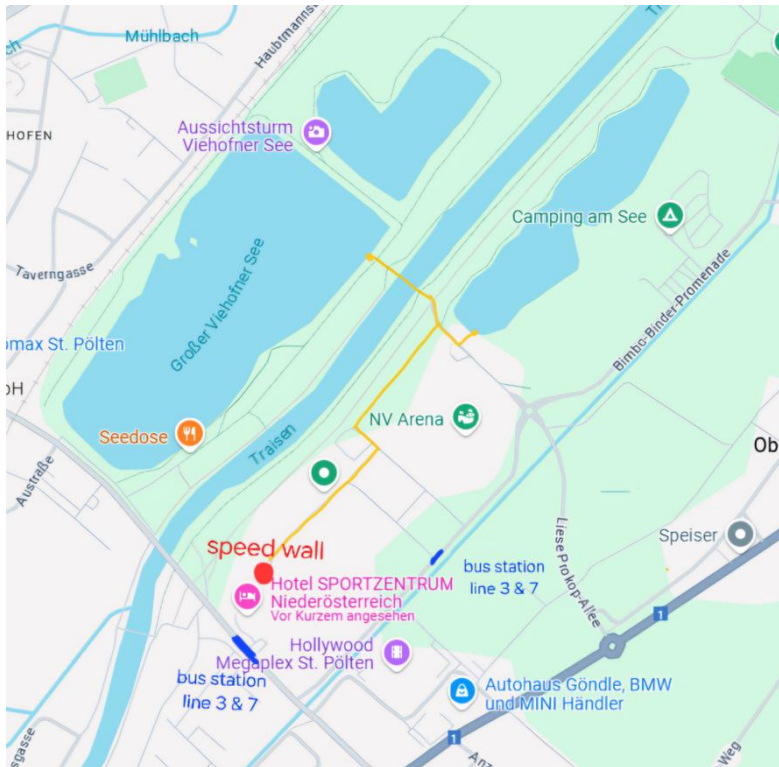

5.3. Travel information

By car:

St. Pölten is located on the A1 West Autobahn, making it easily accessible by car. To go to the venue:

From Vienna or Salzburg, take the St. Pölten Süd exit.

From Krems/Waldviertel, take the S33 expressway and the St. Pölten Nord exit.

St. Pölten is approximately 1 hour from Vienna, 4 hours from Munich and 2.5 hours from Salzburg.

By train:

St. Pölten Hauptbahnhof (main station) is an important transportation hub with regular connections to all major cities in Austria, as well as some major cities in Germany (Munich,...). There are direct train connections from Vienna, Linz, Salzburg, Graz, Innsbruck, and other cities.

For more information on train connections and schedules, please visit the ÖBB website (www.oebb.at). There is a direct connection from Vienna Airport to St. Pölten.

Next to the main train station is the main bus station, the best lines to take to the venue are 3, 5, 6 and 7 to the station "Sportzentrum NÖ".

By plane:

The closest international airports are:

Vienna Airport (approximately 1 hour by car or train)

Salzburg Airport (approximately 2 hours by car or train)

Munich Airport (approximately 4 hours by car or train)

From these airports, there are regular train connections to St. Pölten.

7.1. BOULDER FACILITY

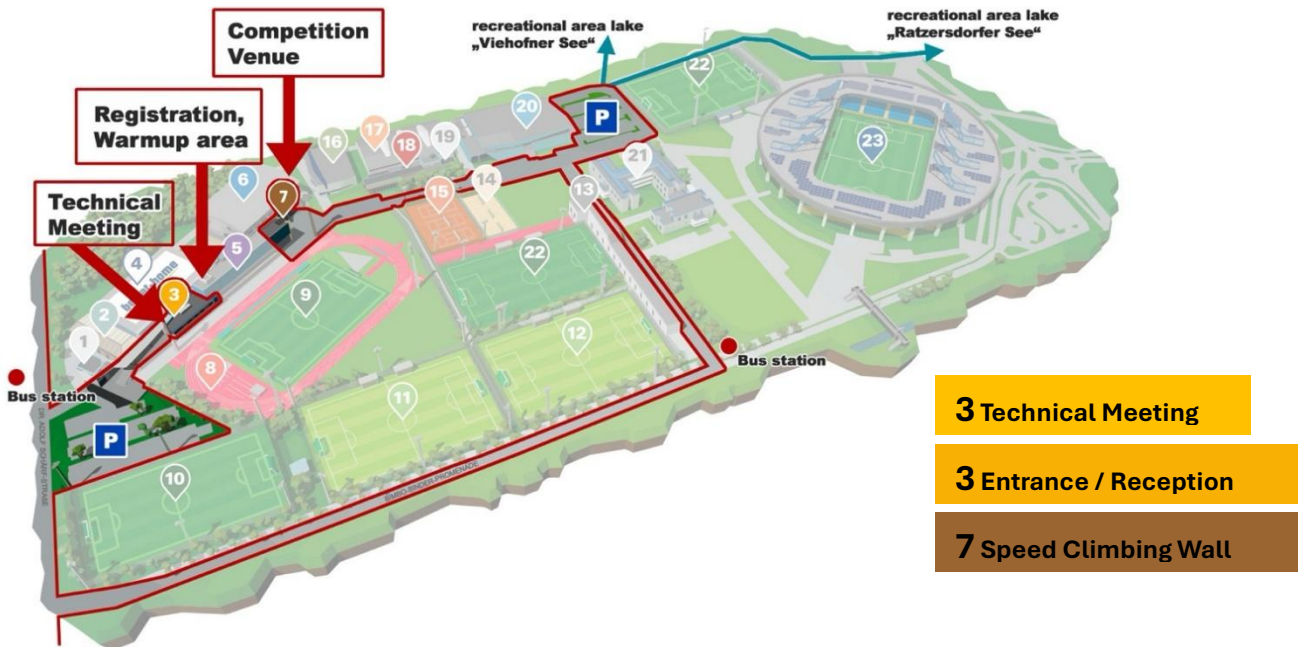
